


THE ALLES FIGHT BACK

- Roosevelt wanted to deal with Europe first, then fight Japan
 - Buildup of troops in Great Britain to use to attack France
 - Assault on German forces in North Africa



PLAS

- Initial Offensive in North Africa
- Stalin was upset because he did not want to fight on the Eastern front anymore



OBSTACLES

- U-Boat attacks
- Allies used convoy system
 - Many ships traveling at once, along with sonar technology
 - Detect objects underwater
 - Destroyed German U-Boats



NORTH AFRICA

- Everyone wanted Suez CanalSupply route
- British stopped Germans at the Battle of El Alamein
- U.S., lead by Dwight D. Eisenhower, stopped Germans again
- Germany surrendered in the North Africa battle



- Allied forces attacked Sicily in July 1943
 - Italian leaders overthrew Mussolini and surrendered to the Allies
- Hitler wouldn't see it!
- Attacked at Anzio
 - Took awhile and not as easy as first thought
- Allies Captured Rome
 - Mussolini executed

EASTERN FRONT: BATTLE OF STAUNGRAD

- German and Soviets battling on Eastern Front
- German advanced into Stalingrad
- Fought for months
 - Conditions were bad
 - Hitler would not send more supplies
 - Forces froze or starved to death



- January of 1943, German commander turned his back on Hitler and surrendered
- Battle of Stalingrad became a key turning point of the war

Axis power retreated from Soviet Union
